3. Put on gloves or keep hands in pockets. Take cover in nearest building.

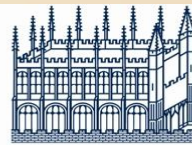


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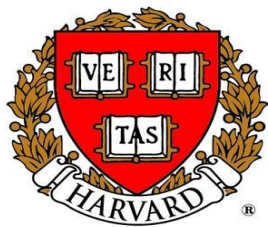
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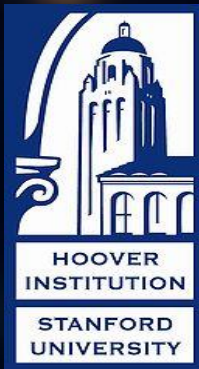
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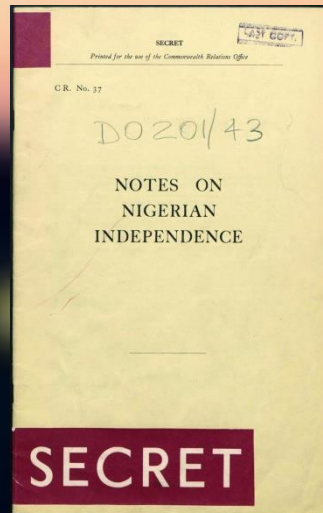
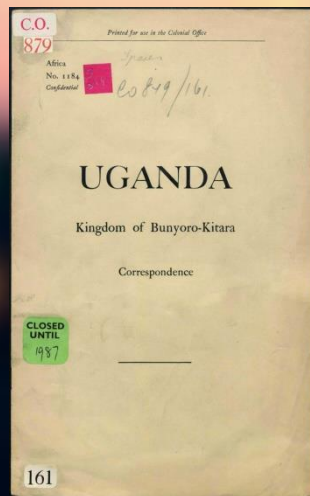

REFERRING to your telegram of the 19th April. The full strength of the forces in Jubaland, consisting the camel corps, is one service battalion and 328 men. I am sending agents to Lerua, Wajeri, El Wak, and Sorori to inquire fully as to the strength and intentions of the Abyssinians. Our Somali Land Chiefs will be informed that should Amadu be threatened by the Abyssinians advancing further, they will be assisted by us. It is not necessary for a gun-boat to be sent at present.

I have received the following information from Captain Devita, 6th (?) Bersaglieri Regiment, lately in command of the troops of Mogadishu, who is leaving for Italy. Five hundred Abyssinians under a Dejematch, whose name is unknown, arrived on the 25th March at Wobbe Shabeyi, which is 35 miles from Mogadishu. They raised the neighbouring country.

The Consul-General of Italy gave them presents and requested that they would retire, but as yet they have not retired. It seems that they . . . at the original request of the Italian Resident at Lugd, Lieutenant Capello. He wrote to Lieutenant Colli, who is Attaché at Adis Abeba, stating that he was in danger and requesting assistance. Devita asks that his name shall not be mentioned, as he thinks that the Consul-General wishes to make the Italian Government believe that the situation is not serious.

Agreement the second of the proposals which, according to the Memorandum communicated by M. Geoffroy on the 25th instant, M. Tittoni had made to the French Ambassador at Rome, suggesting the earlier appointment of a Secret Commission to settle the question of the line of communication between the Italian possessions, and Sir E. Gorst handed to him a modified version of the French draft (of which a copy is enclosed) embodying the above suggestions.

As regards the railway, Sir E. Gorst said that, as far as I was concerned, I had no objection to the French proposal to allow the existing line to be prolonged to Adis Abeba by the Ethiopian Railway Company, on the condition that an English, an Italian, and an Abyssinian member should be added to the Railway Board, and on the understanding that the arrangement included the various guarantees which I had mentioned in my conversations with M. Cambon. It seemed to me, however, difficult for His Majesty's Government to press this proposal upon King Menelik so long as he maintained his present uncompromising attitude towards it. I had done my best to convince His Majesty that such an arrangement would not interfere with the independence of his country, but without success, and I considered that it was rather for the French Government to make any further efforts in this direction.

M. Geoffroy promised to inform M. Delcassé without delay of the substance of this conversation.

Draft of Triple Agreement respecting Ethiopia.

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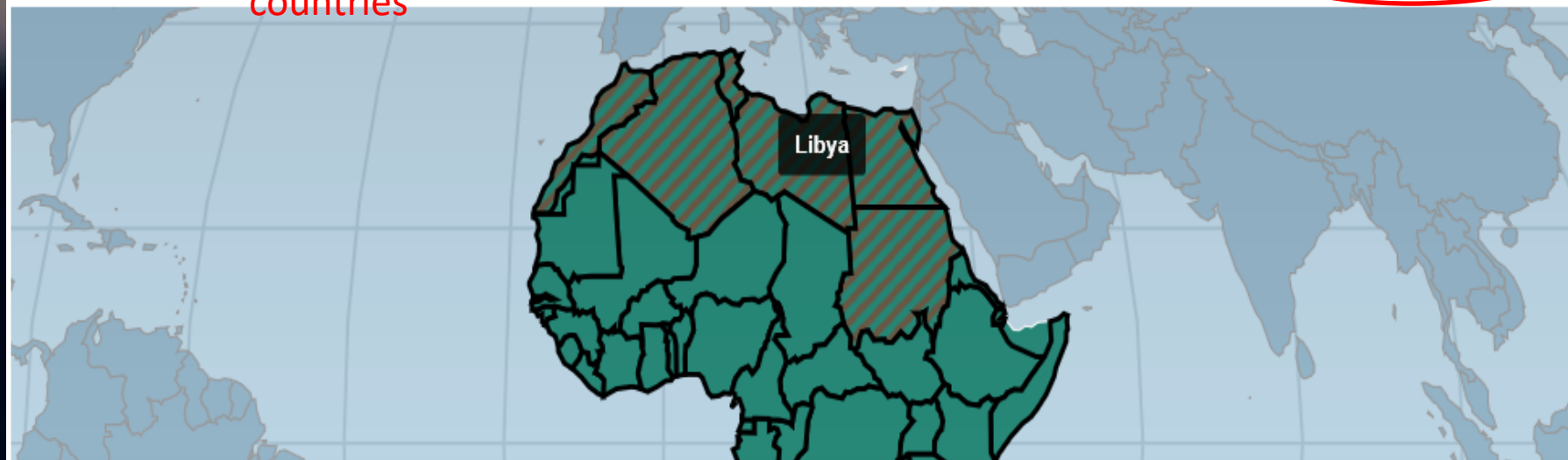
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
